TOURNOI QUALIFICA

Senegals Under-17 team won the WAFU A U17 Tournament for the second time in its history on Monday 4 January 2024 in Dakar. In the final, the Lion Cubs of Senegal beat the Malian Aiglonnets in a penalty shoot-out (3-3, tab 5-4), after a match full of twists and turns and plenty of goals.

Senegal have won their 2nd(ish) WAFU A U17 Tournament trophy, following on from the one they won in 2021. And who would have thought? Trailing 2-0 at half-time, Senegal's U17 team went on to beat Mali in the tournament final.

In a final in which Mali quickly took control, Seydou Dembélé opened the scoring after 53 seconds. Senegal, struggling to get their game going, conceded a second goal in the 44th minute, scored by Bakary Simpara.

Trailing 2-0 at half-time, Malix Aiglonnets thought they had pulled off a major coup. But the Senegalese Lion Cubs showed their will to win and came back on the scoreboard in the 48th minute

through El Hadj Yamar N>Diaye, who had come on as a substitute earlier in the game. A few minutes later, Étienne Mendy (53rd) set the record straight. El Hadj Malick Lo (64th) restored Senegal>s lead (3-2).

Surprised by Senegalys response, Mali threw everything they had into the battle and found an equaliser through Aboubacar Kamara (74).

The 3:1 scoreline led to a penalty shoot-out between Senegal and Mali, where the Cubs showed their precision by taking 5 out of 5 shots compared with 4 out of 5 for Mali.

Senegal, winners of the tournament, Mali, runners-up, and Gambia, 3rd in the tournament, will represent WAFU A at the next Under-17 Africa Cup of Nations in Morocco, from 1 to 19 April 2025.



### **SENEGAL SUCCEEDS MALI**



After the first edition, which took place in Thiès from 5 to 13 February 2021, Senegal, the land of Teranga, was once again in the limelight at the 3rd edition of the WAFU A U17 Tournament, a qualifier for the Africa Cup of Nations U17 Total.

The tournament, which ran from 20 October to 4 November 2024, featured two groups of three and four teams. Group A comprised hosts Senegal, Liberia and Gambia. Guinea were disqualified after MRI tests. Group B comprised defending champions Mali, Sierra Leone, Mauritania and Guinea Bissau. The Lat Dior stadium in Thiès and the Abdoulaye Wade stadium annex in Diamniadio played host to the tournament.

The opening match pitted Senegal against Liberia (3-1) on Tuesday 22 October 2024 at the Lat Dior Stadium in Thiès.

The final pitted Senegal against Mali on 4 November 2024 at the Annexe of the Abdoulaye Wade stadium. The Lion Cubs of Senegal won the trophy for this 3rd edition (3-3, 5-4 tab).

During the final phase of the Africa Cup of Nations, the Senegalese Lion Cubs finished on top of Africa after beating Morocco 2-1. Senegals goals came from Serigne Fallou Diouf (80th) and Mamadou Savané (83rd).

In the third-place play-off, Mali lost to Burkina Faso 2-1.

Senegal and Mali have thus secured their tickets to represent UFO A and CAF, along with Morocco (UNAF) and Burkina Faso (UFOA B), at the Under-17 World Cup Indonesia 2023. At the end of the tournament, Mali occupied the lowest step on the podium after their 3-0 victory over Argentina in the third-place match. Senegal fell to France in the Round of 16 (0-0, 5-3 tab).
